From ...Pr. John's desk

Just having returned from a very restful, pleasant South Carolina vacation, I am quickly reminded of the hectic schedules many of our families keep. It seems there are so many pressing activities; families hardly have time to attend worship and Sunday school. Sometimes we who prepare worship services feel like the mom who spent hours preparing her best Sunday dinner, only to have half of her family not show up - being too busy with other things. **The urgent has crowded out the important!**

Consider these:

- 1) Stop the madness; prioritize what really is important, what is not, and why.
- 2) Make a realistic schedule that includes 'down time' with family and friends; protect and guard that time.
- 3) Back off the computer, turn on the telephone answering machine; stop being available to everyone all the time; say 'No' when you need to.
- 4) Meditate, think your own thoughts; ask yourself how you're doing; talk to God about... whatever.
- 5) Don't make yourself crazy trying to do everything; some of its not your job anyway, delegate or allocate. If you need help, ask.
- 6) Cultivate hearing the Holy Spirit within; listen to your life; seek peace, cut yourself some slack, ask forgiveness, speak forgiveness, and read the Psalms.

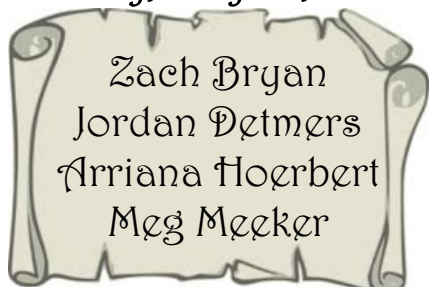

Update from Ghana Christian Mission - excerpts

A few months ago, in consultation with Enoch Nyador and Kris Klokkenga, we agreed it best for Prince and Efiya Yevu to move from Agbokpa to a house in Echi. (A fishing village on the banks of Volta Lake). While fishing is primary, the people also grow vegetables like egg plants, cucumber, water melon and sweet peppers along the shore of the lake. This area is open for the Gospel of Jesus Christ. There are presently two very small churches at Echi and nearby Gavorkope which were started by Christians who came to Echi as fishermen. They were praying for a leader to come and teach them more of the Gospel and to grow in outreach. Prince is an answer to their prayer. His plan of action is to revive these two churches through preaching, teaching, and training potential leaders. Please pray that his efforts will mobilize the Body of Christ for growth in this area.

We thank God for St. Peter's and All Saints and Pastor John for the gifts of a place to live, the motor cycle and your continuing monthly support. Together, we remain obedient to Jesus' Great Commission.

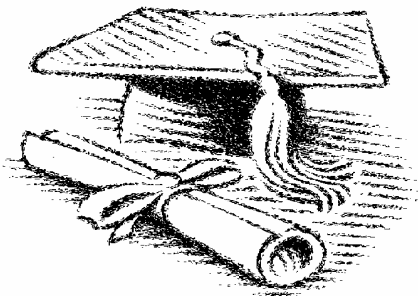
